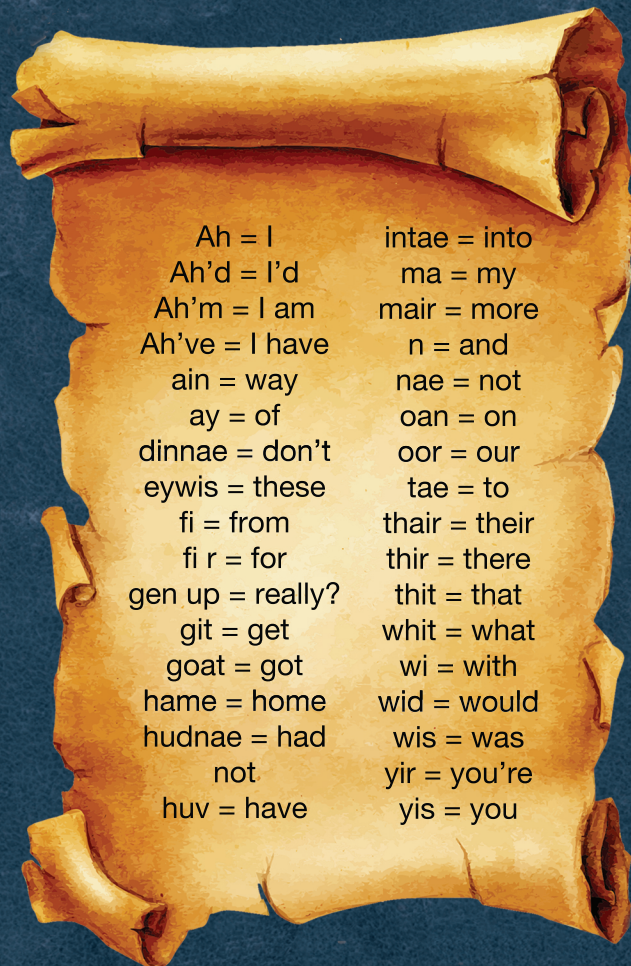


# Orlynd's Dialect
